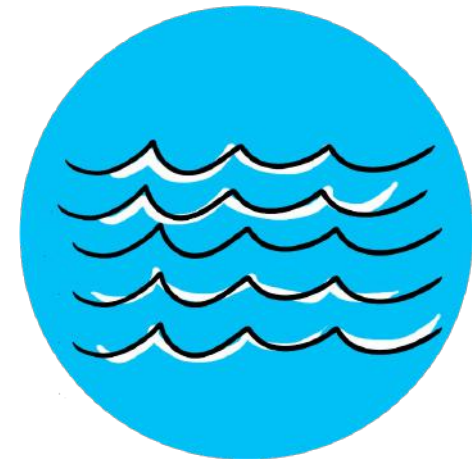


# Hyvin soi!

## 'Ääninen' poetry recital

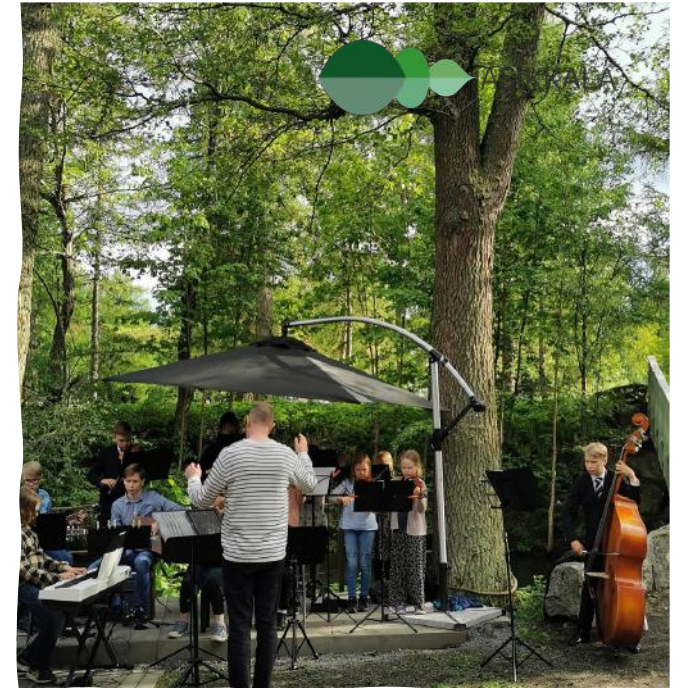
\*The recital (poetry event) is organized to commemorate a local poet, Leevi Lehto. The event takes place in the historical Norrlin gardens.

\*Professor Norrlin (1842-1917) was a renowned botanist. The park was restored in 2008-2010 thanks to EU funding.

- A free concert at 6 p.m. every Friday in June and July.
- Organised outdoors in a café in the park next to Vääksy river and the canal.
- Young musicians get the chance to perform in addition to visiting musicians.
- Organised by Asikkalanseudun Musiikkiopisto (ASMO), which is a local private music institute.



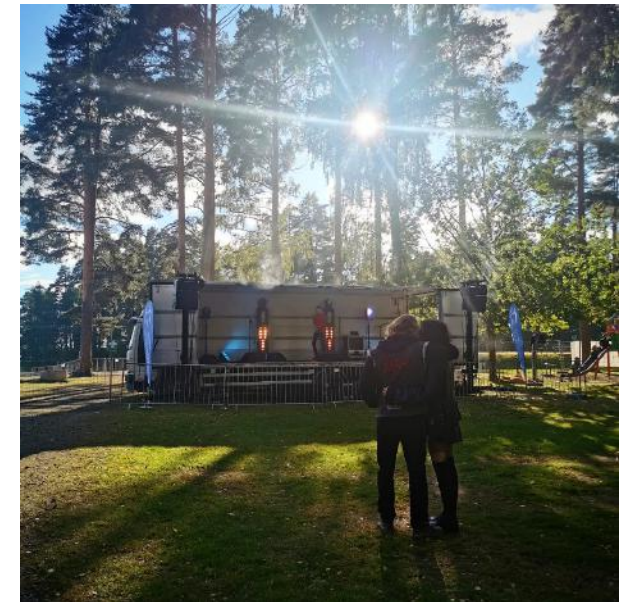
- \* Asikkala Youth Council organises together with the municipality's welfare officials a free festival for young people once a year.
